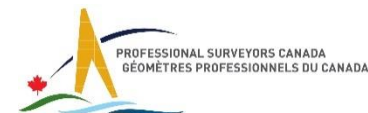

In the same year, the capability gap will reach 1,500 professions as new supply from graduates falls short of the increased demand. • This presentation will identify the focus areas for the profession in the coming few years to ensure a sustainable and increased output from the workforce is achieved.
